FEDERAL YOUTH GAMES 2017

As in previous years, the high jump competitions on Thursday, 30 March 2017 marked the beginning of the Federal Youth Games. Highly focused and with much passion, the participants demonstrated their capabilities, which were enhanced through training. Many of them achieved a new personal best during the event.

On the second day, the games continued in the stadium. With cloudy skies at the beginning of the day, the participants achieved outstanding results in the middle-distance races. However tropical heat set in shortly after the last run of 800 and 1000m. After the strenuous middle-distance run, the games continued with the triathlon

disciplines – sprinting, long jump and shot put/ball throw. The participants set four new school records with their striking athletic top performances. The final round of the competition event were the relays (4x100m), whereby a boys and girls team represented each class. As expected, exciting competitions developed with very tight decisions, virtually pulling the spectators in the gallery from their seats.

The following Monday, successful participants received their certificates, medals and trophies. A festive presentation ceremony accompanied by a colourful photo show honoured the achievements of all athletes.
