

## STUDY AND RESEARCH IN GERMANY

The German Academic Exchange Service or DAAD promotes academic exchange through "Scholarship for the Best", "Structures for Internalisation" and "Expertise for Academic Collaborations".

Germany offers one of the world's best research and education landscapes. There are about 390 state or state-recognised universities in Germany. 12% of the tertiary students (320,000) are international. They offer more than 18,000 degree programmes to choose from, among them about 1,300 international degree courses taught in English.

Studies are tuition-free at public German universities.

### OLD SCHOOL UNIFORMS FOR CHARITY

From beginning of school year 2016/2017, DSKL introduced new school uniform for all students. However from the second half year of 2016/17, the choice to wear the old and new school uniform will come to an end. From February 2017, it is obligatory for all students to wear only the new ones. That means the old uniforms will be redundant. Therefore an idea cropped up to donate the old uniforms to Charitable Organizations which will put the uniforms to a good use.

Dr. Mayer, the principal liked the idea, on condition that the school logo be removed. Since the logo was embroidered, it would be impossible to remove the logo without destroying it. So the solution was to simply to iron stickers onto the logo.

We were fortunate the School Student Board gave the financial help to buy the stickers and as part of Community Service hour, students of class 10 and 11 helped to iron the stickers onto the uniform. To date there are 212 uniforms which are ready and will be distributed to different organizations beginning 2017.
