This is one of the statements students from the German School Kuala Lumpur, SMK Seri Hartamas and SMK Damansara Utama wrote on cars during a car painting activity last October. Other slogans were: "Appreciate the education you are able to get", "What would you change? You are beautiful!" and "Dare to know (Kant)".

Some 20 students had attended the workshop called Children's Conference by the Papiertheater (Paper Theatre) from Nuremberg at Deutsche Schule Kuala Lumpur (DSKL), which was supported by the Goethe-Institut and its PASCH School Initiative. The purpose was to encourage and support children and young people to speak about their thoughts, aims and feelings in a philosophical and future-oriented way. The students also created books and a theater performance.
